



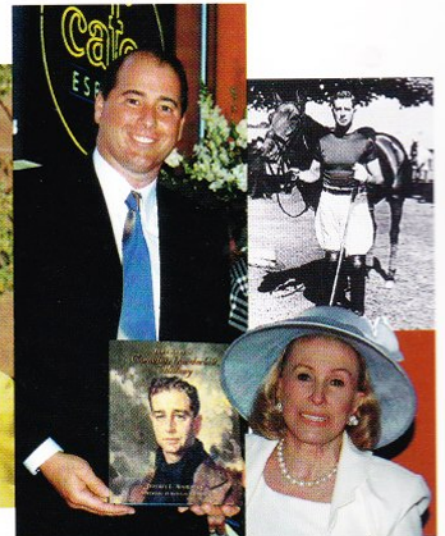
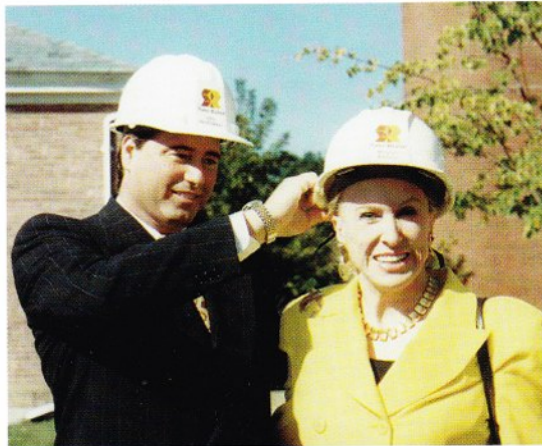

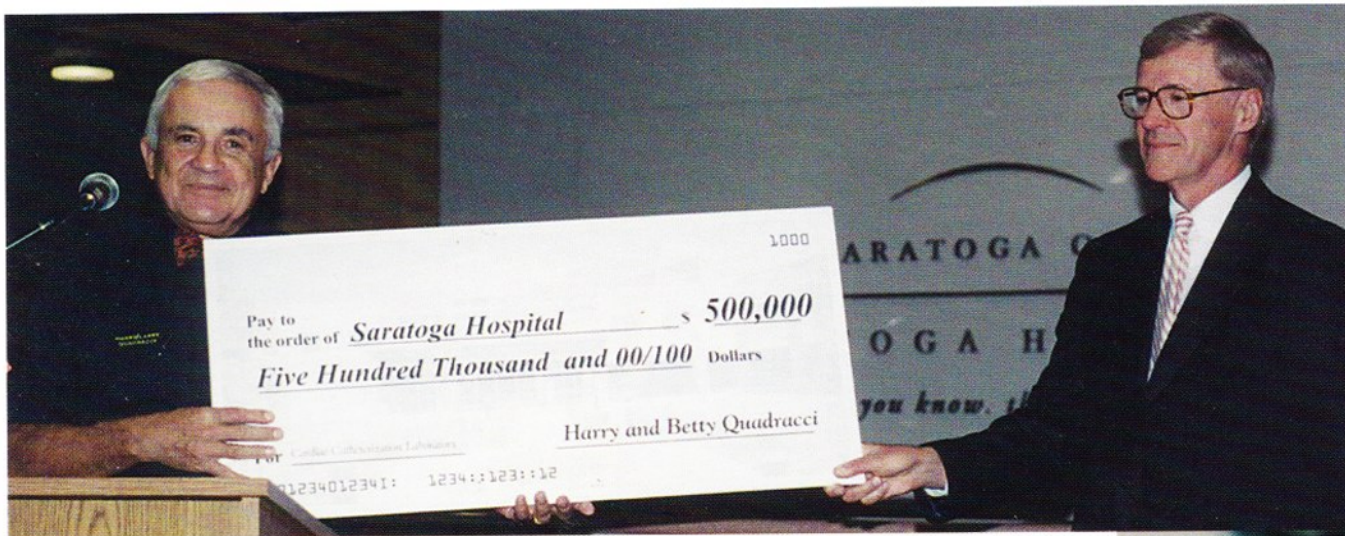

All proceeds from the sale of the book are being donated to the lab, bringing their combined gifts to the cause to well over \$750,000.



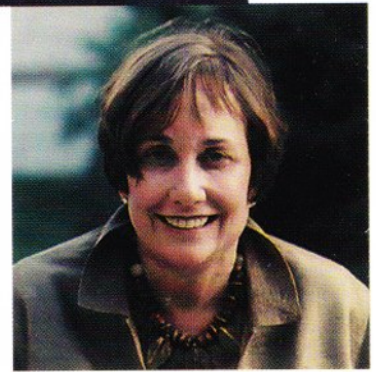

The Campaign for Cardiac Catheterization at Saratoga Hospital got off to a healthy start when some extraordinarily generous souls stepped forward with major donations. Harry and Betty Quadracci of Quad/Graphics took center stage in August when they produced a check for half a million dollars. Their magnanimous gift made headlines throughout the greater Saratoga/Capital Region as "The largest single donation in Saratoga Hospital history." Mr. Quadracci (above left) presented hospital CEO David Anderson with the \$500,000 check at a press conference during which plans for the cardiac catheterization lab were unveiled. Other dignitaries at the event included Marylou Whitney and John Hendrickson (left), who donated \$100,000 -- followed by another half million a month later -- and representatives of Saratoga Cardiology Associates (see photos next page), who donated \$100,000.



WHY A CARDIAC CATHETERIZATION LAB IS NEEDED AT SARATOGA HOSPITAL



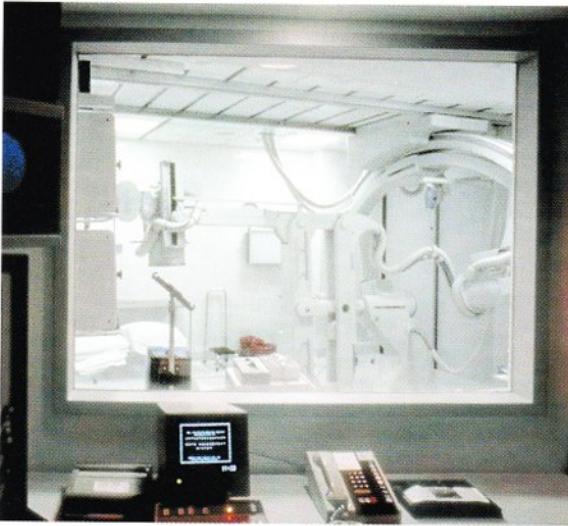
The age groups most commonly afflicted with heart disease (ages 45-64 and 65+) also represent the fastest growing segment of the population in Saratoga County. As a result, community need for cardiac catheterization is expected to increase.



In 1999 alone, some 600 patients and their families were forced to go outside the community for this type of care.



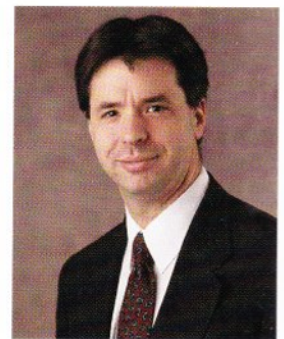
Approximately 800 catheterizations are expected to be performed at the lab in its first year of operation. (The \$4.2-million facility is scheduled to open in the Spring.)

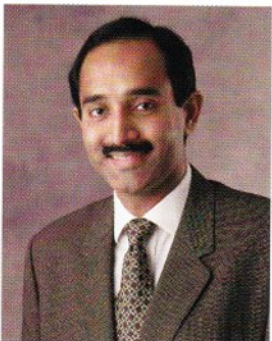
MEET THE CARDIOLOGISTS



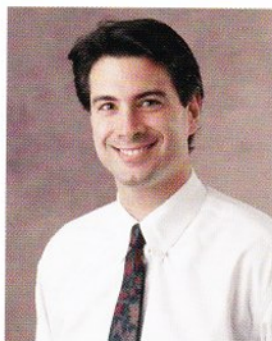

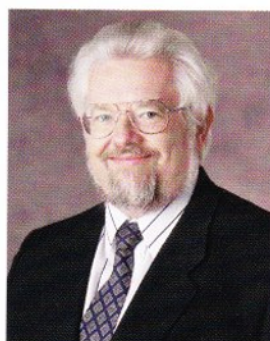
